

### *The American College of Epidemiology Sir Richard Doll Prize*

*The American College of Epidemiology (ACE) is pleased to announce the establishment of the Sir Richard Doll Prize in Epidemiology. This prize will be awarded every three years.*

*The prize will be given to an epidemiologist who has advanced our understanding of the determinants of a disease of importance for health in populations through a body of research that may involve a series of studies, rather than a single publication.*

*In 2007, the initial ACE Sir Richard Doll Prize will be awarded at the 25<sup>th</sup> American College of Epidemiology annual meeting, on September 18 in Fort Lauderdale, Florida. Travel and accommodation will be paid by ACE and the winner will receive a monetary award of \$3000. IEA will award their inaugural Sir Richard Doll prize at the triennial IEA World Congress. Thereafter, ACE and IEA will jointly make the award on a triennial basis.*

#### *Nominations and selection*

*ACE will use an open nomination process to solicit candidates for the prize. Nominations are due by August 21. The nomination package should include a three- page summary of career accomplishments and a CV for the candidate. The nomination will be kept confidential.*

*The prize winner will be selected by the Awards Committee. This announcement shall be posted at the ACE website.*
